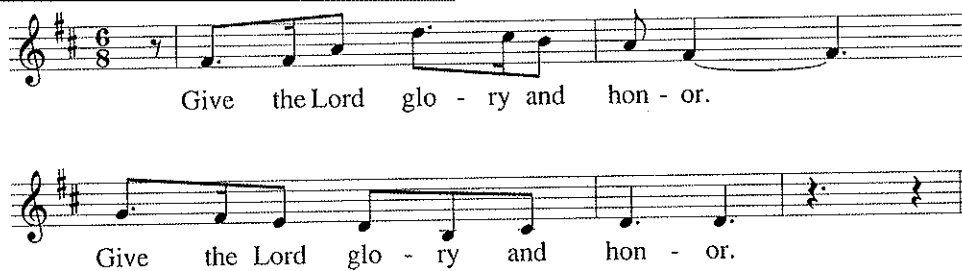
First Reading: Isaiah 45:1, 4-6


Spiritual Communion Prayer (for those not present in the Church)

 Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.*


