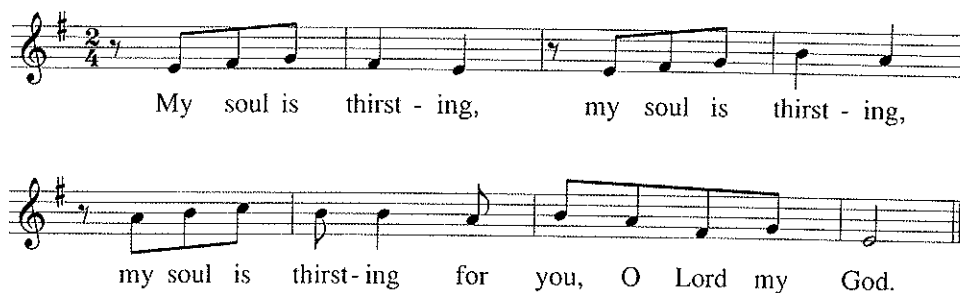
First Reading: Jeremiah 20:7-9

Homily; The Apostles' Creed

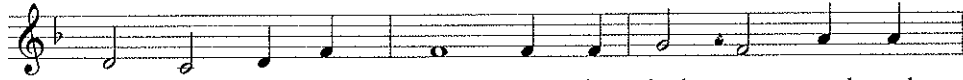
**I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth,

Since I cannot at this moment receive you physically, come spiritually into my heart.






